Friends of SCC is allied with the Stillwater Community Center Foundation. Both work to raise money through grants, donations, and events for projects that enhance and improve the facility.

The Center is the permanent home to: Project Heart, many dance groups, the Stillwater Jazz, the Stillwater Community Band, the Stillwater Community Singers and several churches. It hosts a wide variety of events, conferences, weddings, reunions and just about anything you can think of when it comes to gathering people in a central place.

Friends of SCC and the city of Stillwater together are accomplishing what neither can do independently.

Project #1, completed - Project Heart Dining Room is now the Dining and Event Hall. Remodeled with new furniture, kitchen accessories, lighting, ceiling, paint and other amenities gives new life to this room

> that is suitable for hosting affordable events up to 160 people.

Project #2, in progress - Curb Appeal. A near 100-year-old structure could use some tender loving care. Among the items we've already tackled are some exterior painting, exterior lighting, groundskeeping, and landscaping. There is more to do with painting, window repair and replacement, window treatments, ADA ramps and entrances, and signage on the list.

This is a typical Thursday night rehearsal for the Stillwater Community Singers. Director Judy White lowers her arm and the pianist starts playing an upbeat song. The singers' focus doesn't waiver as they wait for their time to start. Finally the moment arrives. After a breath in unison the choir begins to sing. The sound is beautiful and strong and comes together like one voice filling the practice room located north of the Winfrey Houston Auditorium stage in the Stillwater Community Center.

The Stillwater Community Singers is a volunteer organization that brings the joy of music and performance not only to those who listen, but also the singers involved. The organization was founded in 1994 with a little over 50 members. Thirteen of the original group have been singing in the choir every year since.

The choir showcases three
